Graduation Status

- **Credits—140 credits minimum to be on target to graduate.**
- **Must Pass Algebra I if taken in high school**
- **If you are short credits or need to make-up a “D”, see your counselor.**
- **If you are deficient 20 or more credits, see your counselor regarding On-Site Continuation (OSC) asap!**

4-Year College General Information

- “D” grades are a problem!! Most universities will NOT accept D’s. See your counselor to discuss.
- TA’s and shortened days are not recommended if you plan to attend a 4 year university
- Transcripts – Family Connection or Parchment
- SAT/ACT Scores- Be sure to send directly to the colleges. Scores will no longer be on your transcript.
- Letters of Recommendation (allow 2 weeks)
- Application fee: **CSU-\$55 UC- \$70 per application**
- 4 free college application fee waivers are available via College Board, and are sent automatically with SAT scores when a fee waiver is used for the SAT or sent in late August via email
- Fee waivers are also available thru college applications

Private Schools and Out-of-State

- Requirements vary by school (example: Arizona requires three years of lab science)
 - Check each school/major for specific requirements
 - The Common Application is often used; letters of recommendation are needed.
 - Highly selective private colleges and universities recommend a minimum of five (preferably six) academic courses each year.
 - Admissions testing requirements will vary by school. Check with the individual school.

SAT & ACT Testing

- SSAT and SAT Subject Tests- take in late Spring of 11th grade
- Registration for SAT (www.collegeboard.org) & ACT (www.act.org)
 - **SAT (plus essay for UCs)** - \$49.50 w/o essay & \$64.50 w/essay
 - **ACT (plus writing for UCs)** - \$52.00 w/o writing /\$58.50 w/writing
- Link your PSAT scores to Khan Academy it's FREE!!
 - Customized practice for you
- FEE WAIVERS ARE AVAILABLE! Check out the SAT/ACT Fee Waiver Request Form to see if you qualify and turn it in to Ms. Aguilar in the College & Career Center
- College Board has identified some students as qualifying for SAT waivers. When logging in, those students will see a pop-up with waiver info - PLEASE READ IT! (See next slide)

You may only waive the SAT, SAT Subject Tests, and ACT twice!

- • You're enrolled in a federal, state, or local program that aids students from low-income families (e.g. Federal TRIO programs such as Upward Bound).

- • You are a ward of the state or an orphan.

University Timeline

➤ Application Due Dates:

November 30th – CSU and UC

November to February – Private and Out-of-State

➤ Notification from Schools – February- March


➤ Award Letters (scholarships, loans, grants) – April

➤ Intent to Attend – Must notify school by May 1st

– UC SIR (Statement Intent to Register) Fee: \$250 students can qualify for a fee waiver.

Community Colleges

- Student must be 18 years or older OR have a high school diploma
- Directed Self Placement is used for Math and English
- The SAT and ACT are not required
- There are over 100 community colleges in California

- a. Regular admission for Fall 2020 begins in early November
- b. AVC Priority Registration Fieldtrip

Requirements: Application, Orientation, and self-assessment for English & Math

- c. Honors Program – 3.5 GPA required. The SAT is not required, but can help. Must have completed Algebra 2 & Other A-G Requirements with a C or better.

- **Certificate Programs:** Air Conditioning and Refrigeration Repair, Auto Body, Interior Design, etc.
- **Military:** Navy, Army, Marines, Coast Guard, and Air Force. ASVAB testing required.

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CLASS CHANGES

Every attempt has been made by the counselors to schedule students into the courses they have chosen during registration; however, students must have done their part to help the counselors. This includes only choosing courses for which the student has met all of the prerequisites and identifying alternatives if a chosen course is unavailable. Students were instructed to take the registration process seriously because they were choosing the next year's classes. The only changes allowed in July and August when a student returns to pick up their course list will be if an adjustment is required due to the successful completion of a course during summer school, an addition of an ROP, a Work Experience, a concurrent community college course, or dropping to a five period day for seniors who have earned 180 credits and have written parent permission to do so. Level changes within the same subject will be considered only through the **first progress report only and only if seats are available**. Elective classes, teacher, lunch periods, and/or period changes will not be considered. Second semester class level changes will only be considered for the first 10 days of the beginning of the semester and only for the above-stated reasons.
